
SDNG'S CFMO PRESENTED WITH TOP ENVIRONMENTAL AWARDS

The South Dakota Army National Guard Construction and Facilities Management Office (CFMO) was again recognized for their continued environmental and sustainment efforts, as well as their

project execution and management. The CFMO was presented three awards for their fiscal year 2023 achievements at a ceremony on March 26, 2024.

"These awards showcase the efforts of the SDARNG to be stewards of our environment in all we do because it's our culture, our mission, and it's for our community," said Maj. William Domagall, SDARNG Environmental Program manager.

The SDARNG CFMO was the recipient of the following: The Environmental Stewardship Award is presented to the state or territory with the highest overall score of all the states and territories within the four environmental sections of G-9: Cleanup, Conservation, Technological Innovation, and the Planning division to include the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) score and a military construction (MILCON) score. The SDARNG CFMO received a perfect score in energy management and was a leader in the nation in the waste diversion program.



Environmental Quality Team, third place, was presented to the environmental team based on their management of environmental programs within their state. South Dakota highlights include the completion and improvement of spill containment plans, Energy Resiliency Conservation Investment Program (ERCIP) construction project submittals for energy conservation, and the ability to garner statewide support from the entire SDNG into the environmental programs.

And they received the Region 6 Fred Aron Award. The regional awards are given to the highest performing state in each of the seven regions in eight areas selected by the Branches, the Division Chiefs, and the G-9 Chief. The accuracy, effectiveness, and timeliness of submissions are considered for many of these scores. For others, prudent execution of federal funding in program execution is considered. Scores are reported by the subject-matter experts across the Division based on performance.

"Your work speaks for itself, and the kind of culture that has developed over many years in this organization is worth cultivating," said Maj. Gen. (S.D.) Mark Morrell, SDNG Adjutant General, "It is worth continuing to work on. Who we are matters."

PIERRE TO HOST AIRSHOW

Pierre will be hosting "Let Freedom Fly International Airshow," a spectacular celebration of aviation, patriotism, and community spirit on Memorial Day weekend. Proceeds generated during this weekend extravaganza will be dedicated to Pierre United Way.

The weekend promises thrilling performances and captivating ground displays. Performers include the following.

Jim Peitz, a local pilot, will perform an exciting aerobatic demo in the P51D "Dakota Kid II" from the Dakota Territory Air Museum. He will also give a second performance in his F33C Bonanza.

Vicky Benzing, an accomplished pilot, skydiver, aerobatic performer, and air racer with over 9500 hours of flight time and over 1300 parachute jumps will also be performing.

Kent Pietsch has been performing in air shows in the United States and Canada for over 40 years, entertaining millions of spectators at hundreds of shows. In his iconic Interstate Cadet, he created



and flies some of the most unique routines in the air show industry, including a deadstick glider routine, hilarious comedy act, and a breath-taking truck-top landing.

Matt Younkin's Beech 18 performance is likely the most unusual act on the airshow circuit today. The Beech 18 was never designed for aerobatic flight; however, that doesn't make it incapable of doing just that.

The Chuters are a veteran owned and operated parachute team that provides precision aerial parachute demonstrations across the globe.

In 1980, Warren Pietsch began to modify his 1946 Taylorcraft, reducing the wingspan to 14 feet to become a hyper-maneuverable "clipped-wing". He flies an aerobatic routine that is quick, precise, and up close. This amazing act has a combination of classic and gyroscopic aerobatic maneuvers that demand your attention and leave every crowd wanting more!

Bill Stein has logged over 7,000 hours of aerobatic and formation flight. Bill began flying aerobatics when he was still a student pilot and has been dedicated to perfecting his skills ever since. Since 1995 Bill has performed at air shows across the United States and has entertained millions of air show fans.

Philipp Steinbach, an aircraft designer who flies his own designed aircraft in airshows. The GB1 GameBird he designed, was engineered from the outset to be the best aerobatic and touring airplane in the world.

VA ANNOUNCES NEW PROGRAM TO HELP VETERANS STAY IN THEIR HOMES

On May 31, 2024, the United States Department of Veterans Affairs will launch a new program — the <u>Veterans Affairs Servicing Purchase (VASP) program</u> — to help veterans experiencing severe financial hardship avoid foreclosure and stay in their homes.

VASP is a new, last-resort tool in the VA's comprehensive suite of home retention options for eligible veterans, active-duty service members, and surviving spouses with VA-guaranteed home loans who are experiencing severe financial hardship. Through VASP, the VA will purchase defaulted VA loans from mortgage servicers, modify the loans, and then place them in the VA-owned portfolio as direct loans. This will empower VA to work directly with eligible veterans to adjust their loans — and their monthly payments — so they can keep their homes. With VASP, these borrowers will have a fixed 2.5% interest rate, which will provide a consistent, affordable payment for the remainder of their loan.

Veterans will not apply directly for VASP. Instead, beginning May 31, mortgage servicers will identify qualified borrowers and submit requests on behalf of veterans based on a review of all home retention options available and qualifying criteria. Veterans facing financial hardship should work with their mortgage servicers to explore available options.

The VA anticipates that VASP will result in a government subsidy spending reduction of approximately \$1.5 billion from 2024 to 2033, making it beneficial for veterans, taxpayers, servicers, and loan holders alike. This is because the savings associated with avoiding foreclosures outweighs the cost of purchasing these homes.

Currently, more than 3.7 million veterans have active home loans guaranteed by the VA, and the VA guaranteed 400,695 home loans in 2023 alone.




