The South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs was honored to be a part of Governor Kristi Noem's bill signing reenactment for Medal of Honor Day in South Dakota.

Moving forward, the twenty-fifth day of March will be known as Medal of Honor Recognition Day and will be observed in this state as a working holiday.

South Dakota's only living "Medal of Honor" recipient Michael J. Fitzmaurice participated in the bill signing, along with legislators and SDDVA Deputy Secretary Aaron Pollard.

SDNG WORKING WITH NATIONAL PARK SERVICE

The South Dakota National Guard's Army Aviation Support Facility (AASF) and seven soldiers from the 109th Engineer Battalion partnered with the National Park Service to remove fallen trees and debris around Mount Rushmore National Memorial.

"It's a project and partnership that has been in the works for some time and we were glad to be able to safely remove the downed trees. The alternative would be a burn, and it's just a higher risk to the national memorial that we can avoid," said CWO3 Anton Oerlline.

The AASF provided support with the use of a HH-60M Blackhawk for the airlift mission that removed three loads of fallen trees and debris around Mt. Rushmore.

"We sincerely appreciated the outstanding service and dedication that the SDNG demonstrated in completing the haul mission," said Mount Rushmore National Memorial Superintendent Michelle Wheatley. "We are honored to have had the opportuni-

ty to work with this team."

The AASF utilized the use of a heli-basket to support the lift operation.

"Mt. Rushmore is a major monument in South Dakota and the

United States, so it is important that we maintain, respect it, keep it clean, and be good stewards," said SFC Shawn Dempsey, 109th combat engineer and project coordinator lead for the unit.

The SDNG remains a ready force of citizen-warriors; and partnerships like these are vital to the community and provide valuable training opportunities for the soldiers and airmen.





SDDVA TEAMS PURPLED UP

Last week the South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs team participated in the Day County "What's Brewing" event in




