JOHNSON APPOINTED SDNG CHAPLAIN

Christian Johnson was promoted to the rank of Captain and appointed as the newest Chaplain in the South Dakota Army National Guard in a ceremony held at the Joint Force Headquarters at Camp Rapid on March 27, 2024.

"This is a very special day for Christian, his family, and the South Dakota Army National Guard's Chaplain Corps. Seeing him get pinned with the cross and receiving his chaplain's kit that included his stole was very exciting. Chaplain Johnson has done everything we have asked of him and gained substantial experience



on his journey of becoming a chaplain. We look forward to seeing him do great things for God and country with the soldier's and families of the Guard now that he is official," said SDARNG Chaplain, MAJ David Stimes.

CPT Johnson enlisted in the South Dakota Army National Guard in October 2001 as a chaplain assistant. He deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom from April 2004 through June 2005. Christian attained the rank of staff sergeant and later reclassified as a Human Resources NCO. In 2009, Christian completed Warrant Officer Candidate School and was appointed



as a human resources technician. In 2019, Christian was appointed as a 2LT in the Army's Chaplain Candidate Program.

CPT Johnson has served in the 109th Engineer Group, 196th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade, JFHQ-SD, 196th Regiment (Regional Training Institute), and the 881st Troop Command. Christian is a certified Army instructor and regularly instructs both Officer and Warrant Officer Candidate School.

Johnson holds an undergraduate degree from Thomas Edison State University, a graduate degree in administration, with a specialization in organiza-

tional leadership, from the University of South Dakota and a Master of Divinity degree from Nazarene Theological Seminary. He is ordained and endorsed as a licensed minister in a Wesleyan Denomination, the Church of the Nazarene. He previously worked full time for the SDARNG in various roles and is currently an associate pastor at Real Life Church and an English teacher at Rapid City Christian School.

SDNG SOLDIER SPOTLIGHT: SFC MCGHEE

Alyssa McGhee was promoted to the rank of Sergeant First Class in the South Dakota Army National Guard's 235th Military Police Company in a ceremony held at the Range Road Armory, in Rapid City, on March 3, 2024.

Roughly two percent of all soldiers in the 235th make it to the rank of SFC while in the unit, and SFC McGhee is the first female to achieve this.

"Growing up I always wanted to join the military but was unsure if active duty or guard service was right for me, but I knew I was interested in a career in law enforcement," said SFC McGhee.

SFC McGhee follows in her father's footsteps of service. He served in the Army on active duty for a few years and then joined the SDNG as an engineer.

"Being in the SDNG and having the opportunity to serve is important because I can give back to my community," said SFC McGhee.

SFC McGhee enlisted in the SDNG in 2005 with the 235th as a



31B, military police, and has served through three deployments. Twice in Afghanistan in 2007 and 2013 and most recently in 2022 in Guantanamo Bay.

"They have always supported my military career in law enforcement and help me take care of property and pets when I leave for training, schools, and deployments," said SFC McGhee to the support of her family.

She is a member of the local VFW Post 1273 where she volunteers as staff to facilitate events throughout the year. When she isn't volunteering, she is active in the Black Hills with a local sailing club, mountain biking, and is a lover of all things outdoors.

SFVA CAREGIVER SUPPORT SUMMIT

The Sioux Falls VA Health Care System is hosting their 5th Annual VA Caregiver Support Summit on Thursday, May 23rd, from 8:30 a.m. – 12:30 pm. 
The Summit is intended for VA community partners only. No caregivers will be present, only VA and community professionals. The Summit is an opportunity for the VA to share some of their many resources and to network with community partners.

The VA intends to share information on the VA's programming and discuss how these intersect with their efforts to improve their caregivers' wellbeing: the Caregiver Support Program, Geriatric

Evaluation Clinic, their contracted Adult Day Health Care agency and a VA enrolled caregiver will discuss efforts being made to improve veterans' and caregivers' health by acknowledging that caregivers perform many roles and duties outside of caregiving.

As they launch their fifth Annual Caregiver Summit, they continue to build partnerships with VHA staff and the community, increasing awareness about the many services and supports available to caregivers. These summits assist the VA in building a stronger community that benefits our caregivers and families.


The Power of Choice

The Inspiring Story of Melissa Stockwell, an Army Veteran and Paralympic Athlete Melissa Stockwell served as a Second Lieutenant in the US Army, and was deployed to Baghdad, Iraq in March 2004. Sadly, just three weeks into her deployment, a roadside bomb hit her Humvee causing the loss of her left leg above the knee. After undergoing several surgeries to recover from multiple infections, Melissa was honorably discharged from the Army. As the first female soldier to lose a limb in active combat, she was awarded both The Bronze Star Medal and the Purple Heart.

Despite the tragic incident, Melissa turned to sports for recovery. She made history in April 2008 by becoming the first Iraqi War Veteran to qualify for the Beijing Paralympics. She then shifted her focus to Paratriathlon and went on to become a three-time World Champion. Her talent and hard work led her to win the Paralympic Bronze Medal at the Paralympic Games in Rio de Janeiro on September 11, 2016.


