SD DEDICATES TWO MORE FALLEN HERO BRIDGES

The South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs hosted two more fallen hero state bridge dedication ceremonies.

On Friday, August 2, the SD28 bridge over the Big Sioux River, west of Estelline, was dedicated in honor of U.S. Army Private First Class John Tuin.



Tuin was reported missing in action October 6, 1952, while fighting the enemy in Korea. Tuin's remains are still unaccounted for.

On Monday, August 5, the US 12 westbound bridge over the rail-road three miles west of Groton was dedicated to honor three brothers, U.S. Navy Radio Man Second Class Ordien F. Herr, Naval

Air Force Lieutenant LeRoy M. Herr, and U.S. Navy Radio Man Second Class Eugene L. Herr.

Eugene was first reported as missing in action when he was serving on the USS Johnston, which was sunk at the Battle of Samar. Eugene survived the sinking, but died two days later, October 25, 1944, from exhaustion and exposure.

Having completed over 38 missions during the war, LeRoy's PV1 Ventura bomber crashed while flying over Catalina Island September 25, 1945.

On June 8, 1943, a transport carrying personnel to Sydney, Australia crashed leaving Tontouta Airfield, New Caledonia. Approximately three minutes after takeoff, the plane was seen going into a low turn and disappeared from sight. During the initial climb, one of the engines failed. The pilot tried to return to the airfield, but the aircraft stalled and crashed. The wreckage of the plane was in the water of St. Vincent's Bay about 100 yards from shore. A total of 24 men were killed, one of which was Ordien Herr.



FUNERAL SERVICES TO BE HELD FOR CPL BARTLETT

Funeral services will be held Saturday, August 10, at 1:00 pm at the Little Methodist Church in Blunt for U.S. Army Corporal Robert A. Bartlett.

Bartlett was killed during World War II and recently accounted for by the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency.

In July 1944, Bartlett was assigned to Company A, 744th Tank Battalion, as a crew member of an M5A1 Stuart light tank. His unit was engaged in battle with German forces at Saint-Germain-d'Elle, France, on July 26 when his tank was struck by an enemy shoulder-fired rocket. Two crewmembers were able to escape the vehicle, but Bartlett and another soldier were never seen or heard from again. Due to strong enemy artillery fire and intense combat, surviving crewmembers were unable to examine the tank afterwards. Bartlett was declared missing in action, but the Germans never reported him as a prisoner of war. In September 1950, with no evidence Bartlett survived the



fighting, the Army Quartermaster Corps determined his remains were non-recoverable.

VA ACCEPTING PROPOSALS FOR NEW GRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION INITIATIVE

The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs launched the <u>online application portal</u> to accept applications for the new <u>Pilot Program for Graduate Medical Education and Residency</u>, aimed at expanding health care access for veterans across the country.

Through this pilot program, the VA will reimburse salaries and benefits for at least 100 physician residents who rotate to covered health care facilities — prioritizing facilities in rural and underserved areas, Indian Tribe or Tribal organizations, and Indian Health Service facilities. Other covered facilities include Federally Qualified Health Centers, Department of Defense facilities, and other facilities deemed appropriate by the VA.

One of the priorities of the VA is making sure that veterans have access to the world-class care they deserve, regardless of where they live. Over the past year, the VA has expanded access to care for veterans in many ways — including adding night and weekend clinics, increasing the number of veterans scheduled in daily clinics, partnering with DOD facilities, hiring new clinicians, and much more.

"This program will place physician residents where they are needed most — in rural and underserved communities across America," said VA Chief Academic Affiliations Officer Marjorie Bowman, M.D. "For veterans, this program will make it easier to access the health care they need and deserve."

The VA has played a major role in educating the next generation of health professionals for almost eight decades. Nearly 70% of all U.S. physicians have trained at VA facilities, and approximately 120,000 clinicians train at the VA each year. Overseen by its Office of Academic Affiliations, VA educates health professions trainees across 60 health care disciplines at more than 1,000 VA health care facilities. These training opportunities serve as a workforce pathway for the VA and the nation.

Academic institutions and programs interested in participating in this new pilot program must apply by September 30, 2024. The selected programs will be notified in November 2024, for resident rotations in the July 2025 – June 2026 academic year. An online public information session will be held at 2 pm (ET) on Wednesday, August 21.


