# **SD TO DEDICATE HERR FALLEN HERO BRIDGE**

The South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs will be hosting a State Bridge Dedication Ceremony to honor three brothers, U.S. Navy Radio Man Second Class Ordien F. Herr, Naval Air Force Lieutenant LeRoy M. Herr, and U.S. Navy Radio Man Second Class Eugene L. Herr.

The ceremony will be Monday, August 5, 2024, at 1:30 p.m. (CT) at the High School Gym in Bristol (500 S. 3<sup>rd</sup> Street).

The US 12 Westbound bridge over the railroad three miles west of Groton will be dedicated to RM2, LT, and RM2 Herr.

Eugene was first reported as missing in action when he was serving on the USS Johnston,

which was sunk at the Battle of Samar. Eugene survived the sinking, but died two days later, October 25, 1944, from exhaustion and exposure.

Having completed over 38 missions during the war, LeRoy's PV1 Ventura bomber crashed while flying over Catalina Island September 25, 1945.

On June 8, 1943, a transport carrying personnel to Sydney, Australia crashed leaving Tontouta Airfield, New Caledonia. Approximately three minutes after takeoff, the plane was seen going into a low turn and disappeared from sight. During the initial climb, one of the engines failed. The pilot tried to return to

the airfield, but the aircraft stalled and crashed. The wreckage of the plane was in the water of St. Vincent's Bay about 100 yards from shore. A total of 24 men were killed, one of which was Ordien Herr.

Naming bridges in honor of our combat veterans who died while serving their country is an initiative of Governor Kristi Noem and the South Dakota Departments of Military, Transportation, and Veterans Affairs.

"Our fallen heroes are no longer with us, but their memories live on in the hearts of their loved ones and our state," said Greg Whitlock, secretary of the South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs. "Naming our South Dakota bridges in honor of our fallen gives us the opportunity for remembrance, reflection, and respect. It helps us to honor the men and women who gave their lives in service to this nation. They cherished liberty and loved freedom so much, they were willing to lay down their lives to preserve our way of life."

"We can never underestimate, or over appreciate, the costs they bore for us," said Whitlock. "We must never forget that our fallen sacrificed their future and their dreams. Their memories can only live through the accomplishments to present and future generations."

# **SD TO DEDICATE TUIN FALLEN HERO BRIDGE**

The South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs will be hosting a State Bridge Dedication Ceremony to honor U.S. Army Private First Class John Tuin.

The ceremony will be Friday, August 2, 2024, at 1:30 p.m. (CT) at the American Legion Post 184 in Estelline (222 Main Street).

The SD28 bridge over the Big Sioux River, west of Estelline, will be dedicated as the PFC John Tuin Bridge.

Tuin was reported missing in action October 6, 1952, while fighting the enemy in Korea. Tuin's remains are still unaccounted for.

Naming bridges in honor of our combat veterans who died while serving their country is an initiative of Governor Kristi Noem and the South Dakota Departments of Military, Transportation, and Veterans Affairs.

"Our fallen heroes are no longer with us, but their memories live on in the hearts of their loved ones," said Greg Whitlock, secretary of the South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs. "Naming our South Dakota bridges in honor of our fallen gives us the opportunity for remembrance, reflection, and respect. It helps us to honor the men and women who gave their lives in



service to this nation. They cherished liberty and loved freedom so much, they were willing to lay down their lives to preserve our way of life."

"We can never over appreciate the costs they bore for us," said Whitlock. "We must never forget that our fallen sacrificed their future and their dreams. Their memories will live on for generations."

# TWO YEARS SINCE LAUNCH OF DIAL 988

Two years ago, the launch of Dial 988 then Press 1 made it easier than ever for veterans and their loved ones to access lifesaving support via the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs' Veterans Crisis Line. In these past two years, VCL has answered more than 1,638,138 calls, representing a 22.7% increase in calls per day since the launch. This means that more veterans than ever are getting the support they need from caring, gualified responders during times of crisis.

Dial 988 then Press 1 provides an easy-to-remember number to quickly connect veterans, service members, and their loved ones to the Veterans Crisis Line's lifesaving services. Since the launch of the shortened number, VCL has maintained an average speed to answer of 9.17 seconds. In addition to the increase in calls answered, VCL has also received a 76.7% increase in texts and 27.5% increase in chats per day over the same two years.

Since launching in July 2022, more than ten million total calls, texts, and chats to 988 have been answered, including 1,179,129 calls answered by VCL via Dial 988 then Press 1.

This year, the two-year anniversary of Dial 988 then Press 1 coincides with the 2024 VA/DOD Suicide Prevention Conference in Portland, Oregon. This biannual event — a major platform for advancing the <u>Reducing Military and Veteran Suicide</u> public health strategy — will bring together over 2,000 VA and DOD care team members, leaders, allies and subject matter experts from across the country to share leading-edge research, evidence-based clinical and community approaches, and improved data methods.

Ensuring veterans and their loved ones know how to reach VCL in their time of need, as well as continuing to advance broader efforts to prevent veteran suicide, are top VA priorities. Today, more than 1,000 responders — many of whom are Veterans themselves — ensure that every veteran has somebody to call for support in time of crisis.

# SD CODE TALKER MEMORIAL HIGHWAY DEDICATED

Nearly 106 miles of U.S. Highway 18 has been designated as the Sicangu Lakota Code Talker Memorial Highway. The Memorial Highways application was approved by the Transportation Commission at their June 29, 2023 meeting.

The highway designation runs through Todd, Tripp, and Gregory counties, along with the Rosebud Indian Reservation. The Sicangu Lakota Code Talker designation on Highway 18 is from just east of the Todd-Bennett County line to the



Fort Randall Dam near Pickstown; and runs through the communities of Bonesteel, Burke, Gregory, Colome, Winner, and Mission.



#### **1. Weekly Physical Activity**


This is a chance for patients to share their current activity level and for doctors to suggest some small, simple changes to help people get more active.


#### 2. Family Activities

# **SDNG SOLDIER WINS NATIONAL DSS AWARD OF EXCELLENCE**

Lt. Col. Kathy Gilbert, the South Dakota National Guard (SDNG) Deputy State Surgeon (DSS), was awarded the Maj. Gen. Deborah C. Wheeling DSS Award of Excellence on April 15, 2024.

Gilbert was presented the award at the National Guard Bureau Medical Team Conference held at Camp Robinson in North Little Rock, AR. She was recognized for her commitment to soldier medical readiness and leadership in the medical field.

Lt. Col Gilbert stated, "I am deeply honored to be nominated and selected for this award. To be recognized at the national level for the work we do to take care of soldiers is humbling. The position of DSS is very rewarding and challenging, and I am excited to put South Dakota on the map as having one of the best."

The Maj. Gen. Deborah C. Wheeling DSS Award of Excellence is presented annually to one deputy state surgeon.
