# 4TH ANNUAL MEMORIAL DAY AT STATE CEMETERY



The South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs held our fourth annual Memorial Day program at the South Dakota Veterans Cemetery with over 500 guests joining us.

This year's program opened with the raising of the flag.

On Memorial Day, the American flag is flown at half-staff from sunrise until noon only, then raised briskly to the top of the staff un-



til sunset. The first half of the day honors those who lost their lives while serving their country; the second half of the day represents American courage.

American Legion Post 15 from Sioux Falls served as the Honor Guard for the entire ceremony.

# SD TO DEDICATE 12 FALLEN HERO BRIDGES

The South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs will be hosting 12 fallen hero bridge dedication ceremonies this year, honoring 15 veterans.

In 2019, Governor Kristi Noem and the South Dakota Departments of Veterans Affairs, Military, and Transportation launched the Fallen Heroes Bridge Dedication Program with the mission of dedicating state bridges to South Dakotans who were killed in action while serving their country or classified as missing in action.

"Naming South Dakota bridges in honor of our fallen gives us the opportunity of remembrance, reflection, and respect—to honor the men and women who gave their lives in service to this nation," said South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs Secretary Greg Whitlock. "These men and women, so young and in such a short time, met their destiny on far off battlefields. In return for their great gift, there is nothing more complex or important that we can do but to ensure the memories of their shortened lives go on."

# SDNG FACILITATES ACADEMIC AND GOVERNMENT EXCHANGE WITH SDSM&T IN SURINAME

Three faculty members from the South Dakota School of Mines and Technology (SDSM&T) travelled with the South Dakota National Guard (SDNG) to Suriname April 23-27 for an academic and government exchange as part of the State Partnership Program (SPP). The goal of the exchange was to expand the partnership to include civilian to civilian exchanges in academics and incorporate SDSM&T in planned engineer operations.

During the exchange, SDSM&T faculty members met with the Unites States ambassador to Suri-

name and other senior embassy staff to discuss opportunities for collaboration between the SDSM&T and Suriname.

"We are always looking for new ways to improve and expand our partnership with Suriname. We have been doing engineering projects in Suriname for the better part of the last decade, incorporating the SDSM&T makes perfect sense at this stage in our partnership." said Chief Warrant Officer 2 Nelson, State Partnership Program Coordinator for the SDNG.

The SDNG and SDSM&T are working together to incorporate SDSM&T senior design projects into future SDNG and Suriname Defense Force engineer operations in Suriname. The SDSM&T also had the opportunity to observe a vertical engineering operation conducted by SDNG Soldiers.



While in Suriname, Dr. Laurie Anderson, Dr. Rudrajit Mitra, and Dr. Sarah Keenan met with faculty from Anton de Kom University in Paramaribo where they collaborated on curriculum and established new and creative ways to work together to establish and formalize a Master of Science in Mining Geology between the two institutions.

The faculty members were presented with certificates of appreciation by Army Brig. Gen. Deb Bartunek, SDNG Director Joint Staff at Camp Rapid during a meeting where they discussed and planned for future possibilities of training and development in Suriname.

"It's really impressive how well South Dakota National Guard is regarded in Suriname, and actually in South America in general," said Dr. Anderson.

"We are very proud of our partnership with Suriname and are honored to be as successful as we are with the length of our partnership in that area of responsibility as we continue to grow it," said Bartunek.

The exchange expanded the current South Dakota and Suriname partnership by creating new and exciting civilian to civilian relationships and looks to expand in the coming years.

### SIOUX FALLS VETERANS COMMUNITY PROJECT

During the past six months, more than 66 volunteers from the Sioux Falls business community came together to raise money that was needed to build the village center for the Veterans Community Project in Sioux Falls.

## COPAY CHANGES FOR MENTAL HEALTH CARE VISITS

The United States Department of Veterans Affairs announced that veterans no longer need to pay copays for their first three outpatient mental health care and substance use disorder visits of each calendar year through 2027. This benefit expands veterans' access to mental health services and lowers their out-of-pocket costs.

This copayment exemption benefits dates back to June 27, 2023, and—by law—will end Dec. 29, 2027. To be eligible for this exemption, the outpatient visit must be with a qualified mental

health professional at VA or provided through VA's network of community care providers. The VA will automatically refund veterans for any copays paid to VA on or after June 27, 2023, for these

appointments, with no further action required by those veterans.

In addition to this copayment exemption, VA launched a new policy in 2023 allowing eligible veterans and certain former service members in acute suicidal crisis to go to any VA or non-VA emergency facility for no-cost emergency health care. Since then, more than 60,000 veterans and former service members have used this benefit — providing them with lifesaving care and saving millions of dollars in health care costs. The policy increased access to no-cost emergent suicide care for up to nine million individuals, because eligible individuals do not need to be enrolled in the VA system or go to a department facility to use this benefit.

To maximize access to world-class mental health care, the VA has been aggressively hiring mental health professionals nationwide. Over the last three fiscal years, the VHA hired more than 9,000 mental health positions including psychologists, social workers, psychiatrists, licensed professional mental health counselors, peer support specialists, mental health nurses and mental health physician assistants — including 2,000 hires during fiscal year 2024.

# EXTENSION OF VETERAN FORECLOSURE MORATORIUM

The United States Department of Veterans Affairs has issued guidance to strongly encourage mortgage servicers to implement a targeted moratorium on foreclosures for veterans with VA-guaranteed loans through December 31, 2024.

This new, targeted foreclosure moratorium will help ensure that veterans and their families are able to stay in their homes while mortgage servicers implement the Veterans Affairs Servicing Purchase (VASP) program – a new, last-resort tool for qualified veterans experiencing severe financial hardship. Through VASP, the VA will purchase qualified veterans' modified loans from their loan servicers and then place them in the VA-owned portfolio as direct loans – making the loans more affordable for veterans. VASP officially launches on May 31 and mortgage servicers must have it fully implemented by October 1, 2024.


Veterans facing financial hardship should contact their mortgage servicer and work with them to explore all available home retention options. For additional assistance, veterans can always contact the VA directly by calling 877-827-3702, option 4, or by visiting the <u>VA Home Loans</u> website for additional information.

When a veteran experiences financial hardship, the VA has a range of options to help stay in their homes. The VA's home retention options include:

- **Forbearance Agreements:** Temporarily reducing or pausing payments for those facing short-term financial difficulties. Loan payments will still be owed at the end of the special forbearance and will not be automatically put on the end of the loan.
- Repayment Plans: Arranging plans to catch up on missed payments gradually.
- Loan Modifications: Adjusting loan terms to make monthly payments more manageable.
- VASP: Once a veteran has exhausted all other home retention options, they may qualify for VASP. With VASP, qualified borrowers will have a fixed 2.5% interest rate, which will provide consistent, affordable payments for the remainder of their loan.

This targeted foreclosure moratorium will apply to all VA-guaranteed loans unless 1) the loan is secured by property that is vacant or abandoned, 2) the servicer has documented that the borrower desires neither to retain homeownership nor avoid foreclosure, 3) the servicer has not received a monthly payment for at least 210 days, and the borrower is not responding to the servicer's outreach attempts, or 4) the servicer has evaluated the borrower for all home retention options but has determined that no home retention option, including VASP, or alternative to foreclosure will work for the borrower.
