BRIDGE DEDICATED IN HONOR OF SP4 THOMAS L. ZEIGLER

The South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs proudly hosted a State Bridge Dedication Ceremony honoring U.S. Army SP4 Thomas L. Zeigler on Friday, July 18, 2025, at the American Legion Post in Winner.

The SD49 bridge over the Hamill Dam Reservoir, located just north of Hamill, was dedicated as the SP4 Thomas L. Zeigler Bridge.

Zeigler was born on December 22, 1949, in Winner, South Dakota. Thomas was drafted into the Army in 1969. He served bravely as a Specialist Fourth Class and squad leader with Company C, 5th Battalion, 46th Infantry Regiment, 198th Light Infantry Brigade during the Vietnam War. On March 22, 1971, just one month before he was due to return home, Thomas volunteered to take the point position for a fellow soldier and was killed in action during an ambush in Quang Tin Province.

This dedication brought together family, friends, and community members to honor Zeigler's sacrifice and ensure his legacy will never be forgotten.

SD TO DEDICATE TWO MORE FALLEN HERO BRIDGES

The South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs will be hosting two more State Bridge Dedication Ceremonies to honor U.S. Army PFC Mark Shields and U.S. Marine Corps Private First-Class Ronald C. Dexter.

The Shields ceremony will be held Friday, August 1, 2025, at 1:00 p.m. (CT) at the Community Center in Fort Thompson (1021 Central Circle).

The SD50 bridge over Crow Creek, about twelve miles north of Chamberlain, will be dedicated as the PFC Mark Shields Bridge.

Shields was born on February 12, 1913, in South Dakota. He answered the call to serve his country during the Korean War. Enlisting in the United States Army, he served with the 72nd Engineer Combat Battalion, attached to the 5th Infantry Regimental Combat Team. During the summer of 1950, PFC Shields and his unit were part of the United Nations (UN) forces defending the Pusan Perimeter. Shields gave his life in the line of duty on August 16, 1950, in Chingong-Ni, South Korea.

The Dexter ceremony will be held Saturday, August 2, 2025, at 11:00 a.m. (CT) at the Grant County 4-H Grounds in Milbank (517 Flynn Drive).

The HWY 15 Bridge over the North Fork Yellow Bank River, south of Milbank, will be dedicated as the PFC Ronald C. Dexter Bridge.

Dexter was born on May 21, 1947, in Graceville, Minnesota. Dexter served in the United States Marine Corps as a rifleman (0311) with D Company, 1st Battalion, 26th Marine Regiment, 3rd Marine Division. At the age of 19, Dexter was deployed to South Vietnam in 1966. On September 19, 1966, while serving in Quang Tri Province, he was killed in action by small arms fire.

"It is an honor to recognize the brave men and women who gave their lives for our freedom," said Secretary of the South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs Jeremiah Schneider. "The Fallen Hero Bridge Dedication program ensures their sacrifice is remembered every day. These dedications serve as lasting symbols of gratitude and respect, connecting our communities to the legacy of those who served."

"As we honor their memory, we also reaffirm our commitment to support veterans and their families in every way possible," continued Schneider. "Through these bridges, their stories remain a vital part of South Dakota's heritage and a constant reminder of the freedoms we cherish."





VA AWARDS MORE THAN \$2M IN GRANTS TO MEMORIALIZE VETERANS

The United States Department of Veterans Affairs announced seven grants to educational and research institutions totaling \$2,195,992 to memorialize veterans interred in VA national cemeteries as part of the National Cemetery Administration's <u>Veterans Legacy Program</u> initiative.

The grants will support the creation of documentaries, lesson plans, instructional aids and other educational materials regarding the lives and accomplishments of veterans.

The VA established VLP in 2016 to memorialize veterans through educational outreach and to connect students, educators, and citizens with VA national cemeteries. The program has so far awarded dozens of grants and engaged with more than 15,000 students. Veteran biographies, images, and other content are also preserved on the VA's <u>Veterans Legacy Memorial</u> site, where individual web pages commemorate the lives and service of more than 10 million U.S. veterans interred in U.S. and overseas cemeteries.

"We are grateful for our collaborations with schools and non-profit organizations across the country to help preserve veterans' legacies," said Acting Under Secretary for Memorial Affairs Ronald Walters. "These grants will help ensure future generations continue to learn about the remarkable men and women interred in VA national cemeteries."

The grantees announced today were selected following a rigorous review process. They include:

- National History Day, Inc., \$361,721 National History Day will identify fifty teachers who live within 90 miles of a VA or VA-funded cemetery to each select two veterans who served in the U.S. Marine Corps during World War II.
- Loyola Marymount University, \$350,000 The LMU Digital Veterans Legacy Project is an educational initiative designed to honor U.S. veterans interred in national cemeteries through collaborative research and digital storytelling.
- **Kennesaw State University Research and Service Foundation, \$341,881** The proposed project represents a continuation and expansion of a project that curates the life histories of veterans who served in the late 1940s -1950s who participated in the Civil Rights Movement.
- U.S. Korea Global Strategy Foundation, \$324,999 This project will increase knowledge and awareness of the "Forgotten War" by creating ten new secondary social studies instructional modules, guiding student research.
- Research Foundation of the City University of New York, \$280,000 This project will develop a professional development seminar for 17 K-12 educators drawn from the greater New York.
- University of Central Florida, \$274,439 The UCF project will extend the memorialization of veterans interred in National Cemeteries in Florida.
- West Virginia Humanities Council, Inc., \$262,952 This project expands upon the geographical and academic impact of prior Veterans Legacy Grants Program awards, which have produced 30 veteran biographies in a prior year grant and are creating 26 new veteran biographies in the current grant.

VA, CMS PARTNER TO IDENTIFY AND RECOVER \$106M IN DUPLICATE BILLING

The United States Department of Veterans Affairs announced a new partnership with the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services to eliminate instances in which both agencies are billed for the same health care episode.

As part of the partnership, VA and CMS reviewed medical billings for the last six years for veterans enrolled in both VA health care and Medicare and found \$106 million that was improperly spent on duplicate billings.

The VA and CMS this month will begin sending bills to overpaid providers to recover any improper payments.

Approximately 5.9 million veterans are dually enrolled in VA health care and Medicare, and both VA and CMS pay for a variety of medical care from third-party providers. Until now, however, VA and CMS had no system in place to prevent double billing.

VA and CMS have now established a data-matching agreement to identify medical providers who have submitted claims for payment to both VA and Medicare, helping eliminate overpayments and future instances of double billing.

"We are proud to implement this commonsense reform, which should have been instituted years ago," said VA Secretary Doug Collins. "The money we save as a result of this effort will be much better spent helping VA and Medicare beneficiaries get the benefits they've earned."

"For too long, government programs have operated in silos, enabling improper payments to slip through the cracks at the expense of taxpayers," said CMS Administrator Dr. Mehmet Oz.

"CMS is proud to partner with the VA to root out duplicate billing, recover taxpayer funds, and reduce redundant paperwork and waste so American veterans and seniors receive the care they deserve."

VA EXTENDS CAREGIVER SUPPORT PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY FOR LEGACY VETERANS CAREGIVERS


The United States Department of Veterans Affairs announced that it will soon propose a rule to extend Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers eligibility for certain veterans and their family caregivers through Sept. 30, 2028.

The new rule will extend program eligibility for legacy participants, legacy applicants and their family caregivers for three years while VA continues the rulemaking process to refine the program. The extension will ensure that legacy participants and applicants can maintain their benefits and stability during this time.

Legacy participants are veterans, service members, and their family caregivers who were participating in PCAFC as of Sept. 30, 2020, and legacy applicants are Veterans, servicemembers, and their family caregivers who applied for PCAFC before Oct. 1, 2020, and were accepted into the program on or after Oct. 1, 2020.

"Legacy caregivers have helped shape VA's Caregiver Support Program for many years," said VA Secretary Doug Collins. "This decision underscores VA's commitment to veterans and caregivers across the nation and will help provide consistency and stability to nearly 15,000 legacy participants for years to come."

PCAFC is part of VA's broader Caregiver Support Program, and offers enhanced clinical support for family caregivers of eligible Veterans who incurred or aggravated a serious injury in the line of duty, and meet other eligibility criteria. PCAFC benefits include education and training, respite care, counseling, technical support, a monthly stipend and access to health care through the Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Department of Veterans Affairs and certain travel expenses.
