CAV CONFERENCE

Community Action for Veterans (CAV) will host a two-day professional development conference on September 22–23 at the Denny Sanford Premier Center in Sioux Falls. This year's theme is "Building Communities of Care." The conference brings together service providers, advocates, and community leaders for meaningful conversations, practical tools, and a renewed sense of purpose.

Day One kicks off with the morning plenary: *Leading with Heart* (3.5 CEUs). This opening session features three distinguished leaders whose lives and work reflect a deep, personal commitment to veteran well-being. Their unique perspectives — from federal policy to health care leadership to tribal advocacy — will set the tone for a conference.

That afternoon, attendees will take part in three focused learning tracks (3.75 CEUs) that dive deeper into critical topics affecting military-connected communities: mental health, rural challenges, and military families and caregiving. Each track offers practical tools, promising practices, and opportunities for collaborative problem-solving across sectors.

Day Two closes with a transformative capstone: *Heart of a Warrior* (4 CEUs). Led by USMC Veteran and leadership coach <u>Kelley Moore</u>, this four-hour interactive experience blends neuroscience, values, and Combat Brain Training[™] techniques to help participants reconnect with clarity, courage, and resilience.

In addition, CAV will be sponsoring a veterans assistance expo, where VA staff, veteran service organizations, community service providers, and government partners will offer direct services, resources, and information.

Three soldiers from the South Dakota Army National Guard's 842nd Engineer Company were honored for their swift actions during a vehicle emergency on June 11 near Spearfish.

Command Sgt. Maj. Marcus Stacey presented coins of excellence to Spc. Nicole Erdman, Sgt. Tanner Johnson, and Staff Sgt. Scott Wilcox for their professionalism after a tire blew out on their vehicle during the unit's return from annual training at Camp Ripley, MN.

Erdman maintained control of the vehicle, safely steering it into the median and avoiding further danger.



Johnson secured the scene and directed traffic, while Wilcox responded with a recovery team to remove the disabled vehicle from the highway.

Their quick thinking and teamwork ensured everyone's safety and minimized disruption. Leadership praised their training, initiative, and calm under pressure.




