GOVERNOR LARRY RHODEN SIGNS SENATE BILL 52

Governor Larry Rhoden has officially signed Senate Bill 52 into law, a critical piece of legislation that will allow for the expansion of the South Dakota Veterans Cemetery. This move is designed to address a need for additional space, ensuring that the cemetery can continue to serve veterans and their families for years to come.

It's important to note that, based on current utilization trends, the need for expanding other burial areas at the cemetery is not anticipated within the next eight to ten years. This makes the expansion of columbarium space the priority, as it directly addresses the issue of space shortages for cremated remains.

The signing of SB 52 is only the first step in the expansion process. The next crucial step will be for the South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs to apply for a grant from the National Cemetery Administration.

Governor Rhoden has been a strong advocate for South Dakota's veterans, and his

signing of SB 52 underscores his continued commitment to providing the necessary resources and support to those who have served in the armed forces. By ensuring that the South Dakota Veterans Cemetery has the space it needs to accommodate future burials, Governor Rhoden is helping to guarantee that the state remains a place where veterans are honored and remembered.

"The South Dakota Veterans Cemetery will remain a vital and respected place for veterans to rest, as well as a symbol of the state's gratitude for their sacrifices," said Cemetery Director Erin Brown.

POW/MIA DISPLAY UNVEILED AT STATE VISITORS CENTER

This week, a poignant and powerful tribute to American veterans was unveiled at the South Dakota State Capitol Lake Visitors Center in Pierre. The newly installed the Prisoner of

War/Missing in Action (POW/MIA) display honors the sacrifices of those who have been lost, imprisoned, or made prisoners of war in service to the United States. The unveiling ceremony was attended by veterans, their families, state officials, and members of the public, all gathered to pay respect to those who served and remain unaccounted for.

This display, which will be a permanent feature at the Visitors Center, was made possible through the efforts of a coalition of veterans' organizations, with support from American Legion Post 15 Men's Chorus, Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 959,



the Military Order of the Purple Heart 5355, and the Disabled American Veterans Association (Arthur H. Muchow Chapter 1). These groups have long been advocates for honoring those who served and ensuring that their sacrifices are remembered for generations to come.

The event was organized by Senator Larry Zikmund, who played a central role in bringing the display to fruition. During the ceremony, Senator Zikmund expressed his gratitude to the state of South Dakota and the Bureau of Administration for their cooperation in allowing the veterans to have this display at the Visitor Center.
