SDDVA MEMORIAL DAY PROGRAMS

The South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs will host its annual Memorial Day programs on Monday, May 26, 2025.

The first will be held at the Michael J. Fitzmaurice State Veterans Home, located at 2500 Minnekahta Avenue, Hot Springs. The program will begin at 10:00 a.m. (MT).

MJFSVH Superintendent Danny Tiger will be the keynote speaker.

The second program will be held at the South Dakota Veterans Cemetery, located at 25965 477th Avenue, Sioux Falls. The program will begin at 12:00 p.m. (CT).

Former District 18 Senator Jean Hunhoff will be the keynote speaker. Hunhoff is a distinguished South Dakotan known for her lifelong commitment to public service and advocacy for veterans and their families.

"Memorial Day is a solemn reminder of the brave heroes who gave their lives for our freedom," said South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs Secretary Jeremiah Schneider. "It's a privilege to gather as a state to honor their sacrifice and reaffirm
