On November 26, 2019, South Dakota launched the Fallen Heroes Bridge Dedication Program. The program dedicates state bridges to South Dakota heroes who died while in active service, were a prisoner of war or were missing in action.

The James River Bridge on HWY 44, near Parkston, is dedicated to SSG Jason W. Montefering and SGT Jeremiah J. Boehmer of Parkston. Montefering served in the United States Army from January 1978 – July 2005.

Staff Sergeant Montefering, 27, was a member of K Troop, 3rd Squadron, 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment from Ft. Carson, Colorado. He died July 24, 2005, while on his second tour in Iraq.

He was described as a quiet soldier who became a steady leader. “Sgt. Monte” – was “always looking out for the best interests of those around him.”

From his obituary:

Jason W. Montefering was born January 23, 1978, to Allen and Lorraine Montefering at Parkston, SD. He attended Parkston High School, graduating in 1997. On June 17, 1997, he enlisted in the United States Army and moved to Ft. Knox, Kentucky for basic training. He was stationed at Camp Armstrong in Germany for three years before moving to Fort Carson, Colorado, in order to be closer to home.

During his off hours he enjoyed collecting tractors and fishing.
