ASBESTOS RELATED DISEASES

Inhalation of asbestos fibers can lead to several health conditions including interstitial pulmonary fibrosis (asbestosis); tumors; mesotheliomas of pleura and peritoneum; cancers of the lung, gastrointestinal tract, urogenital system and many others.

During the 20th century the Navy and other branches of the military employed asbestos products in ships, buildings and other military facilities. Most insulation and construction materials before the mid 1970's contained asbestos. Asbestos was especially prevalent in Navy and Coast Guard ships of that era. Some of the most common products were:

- Insulation on pipes and boilers
- Fireproofing spray insulation
- Firebrick and gunnite used for internal insulation of furnaces, boilers and other vessels
- Roof, floor and ceiling tiles
- Brakes and clutches

Navy personnel at the greatest risk for asbestos related diseases include:
